# Advancing Excellence in Care and Community

Our organization continues to be a home of choice for both Jewish and non-Jewish communities, known for exceptional care, meaningful programs, and a warm, inclusive environment. This past year, we remained steadfast in our advocacy with the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority and government partners to secure sustainable funding and address the ongoing need for enhanced staffing. Ensuring that Residents receive the highest standard of care remains our foremost

We also took important steps in investing in our staff, launching the inaugural Simkin Centre Foundation Staff Bursary Award. This award, proudly presented to two deserving team members, reflects our strong commitment to supporting and encouraging the growth of our dedicated workforce. Community generosity played a pivotal role in our achievements, highlighted by the 13th Annual Simkin Stroll, held in honor of Bill Brownstone. Together, we raised a record-setting \$115,000 to support music and recreation programs—an inspiring demonstration of the commitment of our supporters.

Equally meaningful were the moments of joy shared by our Residents. A highlight was our summer trip to Winnipeg Beach, where Residents experienced the sand and water, with four Residents using our water wheelchair to enjoy the lake for the first time. Looking ahead, we are exploring initiatives such as a daycare facility, enhanced spaces for community engagement, and a dedicated hospice care area. These efforts, alongside the extraordinary dedication of our Boards, staff, volunteers, partners, Residents, and families, position us to shape a future that is bright, compassionate, and full of promise.

# Maintaining Vigilance, Restoring Normalcy

What does 'normal' look like when assessing the overall medical status of Residents living in a personal care home such as Simkin Centre? Quite honestly, as Medical Director of Simkin Centre (Sharon Home) over a very long timespan, I would be hard-pressed to provide specific criteria to that term. Nevertheless, this past year 'feels' as close to 'normal' as we have been for a number of years, particularly when using the pandemic era as the reference point.

Yes, there have been some mini outbreaks over the past year. Yes, there have been times when those outbreaks have limited free movement throughout the units, but the extent of disruption to the daily lives of our Residents (and staff) has been relatively minor and brief. A high index of suspicion and rapid intervention by staff have been instrumental in the containment of those outbreaks. The lessons learned during those very challenging

pandemic days (months, years) were invaluable in mitigating the overall detrimental impact on Residents. The ability to enable Residents to attend and participate in the (too many to count) in-house recreational activities, community cultural events, museums, day excursions (including to Winnipeg Beach!), restaurant dining, etc., is testimony to the benefits of maintaining a vigilant medical surveillance philosophy, with timely treatment only when absolutely necessary.

Our medical team consists of six physicians, many of whom have been providing services not only to Simkin Centre Residents, but to residents at other long-term care facilities. Their broad experience THE MEDICAL TEAM across multiple centres has contributed significantly to the high standard of care provided to our Residents. Once again, I want to thank the members of my medical Dr. Louis Chung

of Simkin Centre.

On behalf of my colleagues, I want to take this opportunity to thank all Simkin Centre staff, Senior Management, and the Simkin Centre Board of Directors for their amazing dedication and tireless efforts over the past year. As well, I would be remiss in not acknowledging the continuous support from our community.

# Driving Continuous Improvement in Care

## Alanna Kull, RN BN, Director of Care



The Resident Care Team remains committed to innovation, quality improvement, and Resident-focused care. Over the past year, we expanded programs supporting Residents' physical, emotional, and cognitive well-being.

## 1. Workforce Stability

• Amid sector-wide shortages, we maintained a zero nursing vacancy rate for most of the yearreflecting strong recruitment, retention, and a positive work environment.

#### 2. Mobility & Equipment

• We launched an annual Walker and Wheelchair Maintenance Program to keep mobility aids safe, functional, and tailored to Resident needs, minimizing downtime and supporting independence.

#### 3. Resident Experience

• Bathing environments were enhanced with personalized music and aromatherapy, creating a calming, spa-like atmosphere that enriches daily care.

#### 4. Rehabilitation Expansion

• We hired a full-time physiotherapist and a Kinesiologist, launched a HCA Walking Program, and integrated a Range of Motion Program, improving mobility and functional outcomes.

### 5. Medication Stewardship

• We are reducing antipsychotic use to 15%, aligned with national best practices. Simkin 2 received \$7,000 through the Sparking Change project, recognizing leadership in this area.

We extend heartfelt thanks to the Resident Care team for their dedication, compassion, and professionalism. Their commitment ensures exceptional care and a nurturing, person-centered environment - the heartbeat of our organization.

# Nurturing Spiritual Zife and Community

#### Rabbi Matthew Leibl



In the Torah, the Jewish new year begins in the spring, so it's fitting to reflect, from one spring to the next, on the work of our Spiritual Care Department.

Between Dorit and Yomi (our Spiritual Health Practitioners), Steven Hyman (our prayer leader), and myself, we have someone from Spiritual Care on-site every day of the week.

And the Spiritual Care Calendar is quite full every month:

- Programs on the units (Nurturing Neshama, Ask the Rabbi)
- Drop-in sessions (Bible Study, Wednesday Wakefulness in the Synagogue)
- · Religious services (Friday Night Lights, Shabbat Morning Services, Jewish holiday services, and monthly Non-Denominational Christian services)

In our most recent Resident and Family surveys, 97% of Residents who participated felt Simkin Centre staff respect their spiritual and cultural needs, while families who participated gave us a mark of 100% for the same question. That's something to be proud of for sure!

A highlight of the year, both personally and for the department, was the Installation Dinner at the Centre organized in November 2024. It also marked the one-year anniversary of Friday Night Lights, our musical Kabbalat Shabbat program, which has quickly become one of our most popular and well-attended programs every week.

We also reviewed and updated the Simkin Centre's Guidelines for Shabbat and Festive Days. The Spiritual Care Committee, chaired by Penny Yellen, led the review process and the final recommendations were approved by the Board. These recommendations included allowing music for religious services if the music could enhance the Resident experience. This gave us the green light to use the keyboard during our Passover Seder for the first time. The keyboard and the extra music breathed new life into the Seder and the reception from Residents and families was overwhelmingly positive.

To everyone involved in Spiritual Care at Simkin I say Yasher Koach - may we continue to go from strength to strength throughout the coming year.




